### Conference Venue

The conference will take place on the campus of the Hanover University of Music, Drama and Media (HMTMH).

### Hochschule für Musik, Theater und Medien Hannover in the buildings Neues Haus 1 and Seelhorststraße 3

Most of the conference talks will take place in the musicology department in Seelhorststraße 3. Performances and lunches will take place in the nearby **“Ear Building”** (Neues Haus 1), the uniquely-designed main building that is shaped like an ear, opening up to the surrounding wood on its north side. Lunches including vegan and vegetarian choices will be available for delegates to purchase, at the University Canteen which is in the Ear Building.

Hanover University of Music, Drama and Media is Germany's third-largest arts university and one of its most renowned institutions for professional training and academic study in the cultural and artistic field. 360 teachers, amongst them numerous internationally celebrated artists, educationalists and academics, teach nearly 1,500 students from all over the world in 33 study programs and world-class master classes. It arranges up to 500 cultural events open to the public every year.

The main train station Hannover Hauptbahnhof is about half a mile from the conference venue. You may walk or take in front of the train station (Ernst-August-Platz) the bus 128 or 134 (direction Peiner Straße), and get off at Hindenburgstraße.

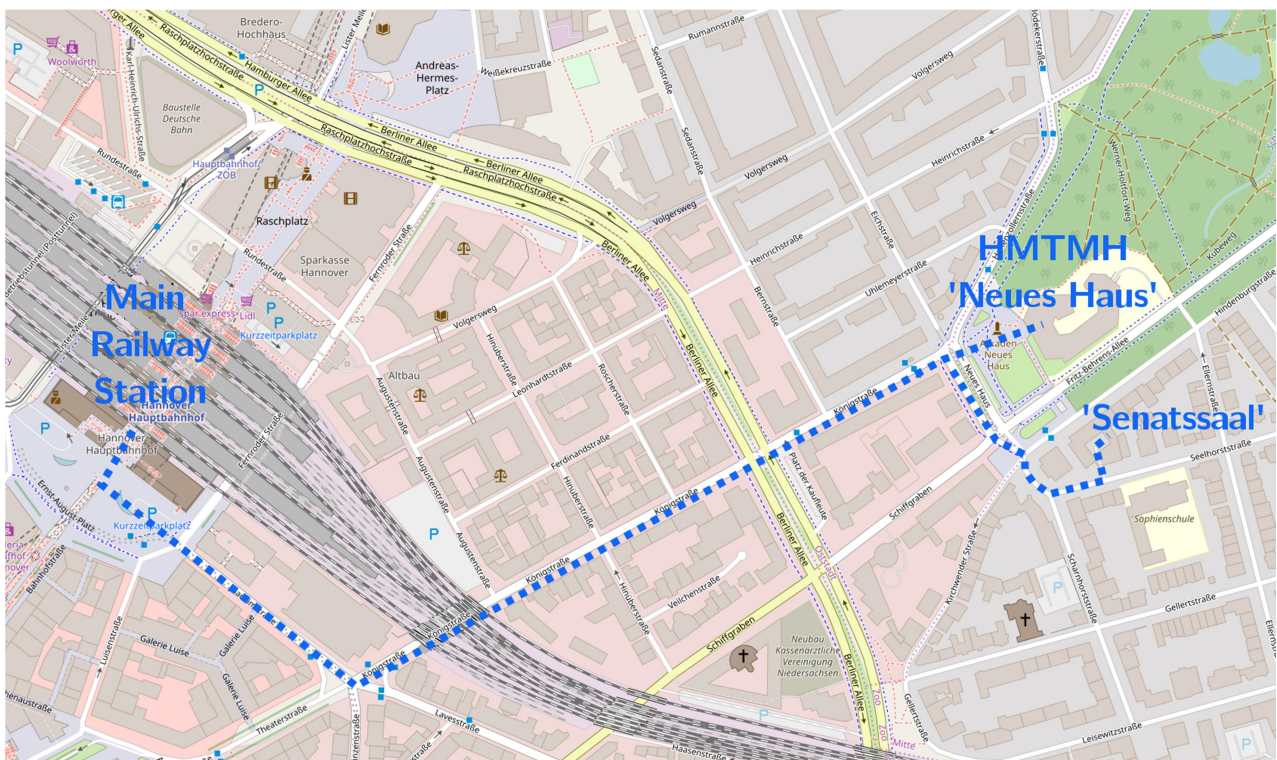
